

DIRECTIVE 2008-98

October 21, 2008

To: Cuyahoga County Board of Elections

Re: **Official Canvass – 11^h Congressional District – October 14, 2008 Special Congressional Democratic Primary Election**

Timeline for Official Certification

Under R.C. 3505.32(A), the official canvass of the October 14, 2008, special congressional primary election may begin no earlier than 11 days after the election (Saturday, October 25). Your board must conduct and complete the official canvass and certify the results all on the same day – **Saturday, October 25, 2008**, as provided on the 2008 Expedited Special Congressional Election Calendar that accompanied Directive 2008-75.

Before October 25, 2008, your board may examine poll books, poll lists or signature poll books, and tally sheets, and compare them to the summary statements. Any errors, defects or omissions must be noted and reconciled. Your board may verify the eligibility of persons casting provisional ballots and the validity of the required provisional voter statements. (See Dir. 2008-81)

Instructions for Official Canvass

In order for your board to declare and certify official results, all valid ballots cast in the October 14, 2008 special congressional primary election – including eligible ballots cast at the polls, provisional ballots and all absentee ballots – must be included in the official canvass.

- **Optical scan**

1. **Central Count (absentee and provisional ballots):** Under R.C. 3505.32(C), first scan and tally all eligible ballots that were not included in the unofficial canvass. Set the central scanners to reject blank ballots *and* overvoted ballots. The board must designate inspection teams comprised of an equal number of board employees from each major political party to inspect the rejected ballots and, if possible, determine voter intent. (See Directive 2008-69)

Voter intent must be determined by examining the ballot for a consistently made marks that are contrary to voting instructions as provided in R.C. 3506.21(B). Examples of marks that must be counted as valid include those made by a voter who, rather than filling in the oval or box, underlined or circled a choice; circled the oval or box beside a choice; made an “X”, checkmark or other recognizable mark beside the choice; or marked the ballot with a writing instrument not recognized by tabulator.

2. **Precinct Count:** Your board then must rerun the precinct/polling place memory card and verify the count matches the unofficial count. If it does not, the board must run all ballots

through the tabulator and set it to reject blank ballots and overvoted ballots. The board must designate inspection teams consisting of an equal number of board members and/or employees from each major political party to efficiently inspect the rejected ballots and to determine voter intent.
