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DIRECTIVE 2016-44 **November 4, 2016**

To: All County Boards of Elections
Directors, Deputy Directors and Board Members

Re: Post-Election Cure Period for Absentee and Provisional Ballots

BACKGROUND

The United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit recently held that the seven day post-election cure period for absentee and provisional ballots established by state law¹ is constitutional.² This week, the Supreme Court of the United States denied a petition to stay the appeals court's decision.³

The seventh day after the November 8, 2016 Presidential General Election is Tuesday, November 15.

INSTRUCTIONS

Every board of elections must be open to the public on each of the seven calendar days immediately following Election Day, and during the hours specified below, in order for voters to cure a deficiency on an absentee or provisional ballot, as provided for in state law.

- November 9, 10, and 11 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.
- November 12 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.
- November 13 1 p.m. – 5 p.m.
- November 14 and 15 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.
