Board Members, Directors, and Deputy Directors

Re: Updated Election Official Manual

BACKGROUND

The Election Official Manual ("EOM") is a foundational resource for election officials across Ohio. It outlines board responsibilities, office operations, and all aspects of election administration. Today, I am issuing replacement permanent directives for all chapters of the EOM, including updated guidance reflecting clarifications and changes to the law. These updated chapters were published July 7, 2026, as draft directives on the Secretary of State's website for public review and comment. We appreciate everyone who took the time to share feedback with us, and my office reviewed and considered all comments.¹

All previous directives that constituted the EOM are hereby rescinded and archived on the Secretary of State's website.²
